

Central High School Summer School 2009

Central High School will be offering a summer school program to help students who have failed and/or have not received credit for a class needed for graduation. Eight other courses (ACT Prep, Health, P.E., Personal Finance, Art, Keyboarding, Woods/Metals and Computer Applications) will also be offered for credit that can be used to supplement credits during the regular school year. You are strongly encouraged to sign up for any class by filling out the attached sign up sheet and returning it to your first period teacher. We will also be offering enrichment classes to students designed by our faculty members.

IT IS STRONGLY RECOMMENDED THAT A STUDENT ENROLL IN SUMMER SCHOOL IF HE/SHE HAS FAILED AND/OR NOT RECEIVED CREDIT FOR A REQUIRED CLASS NEEDED FOR GRADUATION. The regular Summer School Program begins on Monday, June 1 and ends on Friday, June 26. There are two semesters of summer school credit offered. The first semester begins on Monday, June 1 and ends on Friday, June 12. The second semester begins Monday, June 15 and ends on Friday, June 26. Classes begin promptly at 7:40 a.m. and end at 2:40 p.m. Breakfast and lunch will be served on campus and are free. **Transportation will be provided with buses running on a limited basis in the morning and evening. Transportation is only provided during the regular summer school schedule from Monday, June 1 through Friday, June 26. A bus schedule can be accessed through the district website or at any school building main office.** Enrichment summer school classes can begin and run anytime between Tuesday, May 26 and Friday, July 31.

Credit recovery courses in all core area classes (Math, English, Science and Social Studies) will be offered. The eight courses of ACT Prep, Health, P.E., Personal Finance, Art, Keyboarding, Woods/Metals and Computer Applications will be offered for credit that can be used to supplement credits during the regular school year. We must have at least 15 students in each class in order to offer the class for credit. You are strongly encouraged to sign up for these classes with the attached form. Two weeks of instruction equals ½ credit, four weeks of instruction equals 1 credit.

A Credit Recovery pre-session will be offered from Tuesday, May 26 through Friday, May 29 from 8a.m.-3p.m. At least fifteen students must sign up in order for the pre-session class to be offered. No transportation is provided for pre-session. If you are interested in the Summer School Program and would like to attend, please complete the enrollment form attached and return it as soon as possible to your first period teacher or the high school counselor's office.
